
About Us:

Project Highlights

Location: Sriperumbudur Block, Kancheepuram District

Focus Areas: Infrastructure and Soft skills Development

Donor: Plan International (India Chapter) /Mobis India Foundation Period: July'19 to Mar'23

The project aimed to reduce poverty and vulnerability among rural communities, with special focus on children and women. It followed a sustainable integrated village development approach to improve overall well-being.

The three-year project was completed successfully. It focused on improving ICDS centres and school infrastructure to create safe and child-friendly learning



spaces.

Major works included construction of individual household toilets, renovation of village ponds, and construction of a community centre.

Key Milestones

- 15 pucca houses constructed for vulnerable families in three villages
- Community hall with compound wall completed at Nemili, benefiting 424 families
- Village ponds renovated in Mannur and Nemili
- 225 individual household toilets constructed, promoting health and hygiene
- Model kitchen constructed at TELC Primary School, Mannur, benefiting 40 children
- Renovation completed in two schools,

Along with infrastructure development, the project supported capacity building and social development. Activities included training for School Management Committees, life skills and career guidance for adolescents, vocational training and job fairs for youth, and livelihood and income generation support for women Self Help Groups. Health camps, awareness meetings, summer camps, and campaigns on child rights, gender

equality, and environmental protection were also conducted.

All project objectives were achieved, and the project was completed successfully. The created infrastructures were formally handed over to the communities, schools, Panchayats, and government departments. Strong partnerships were built with local institutions and donor agencies throughout the project period.

Inauguration and Handing Over

With the support of **Plan International (India Chapter)** and **Hyundai Mobis India Foundation**, a community centre was constructed at Nemili village with approval from the Kancheepuram District Collectorate. The centre was inaugurated on **27 February 2023** in the presence of senior representatives from Mobis India Limited and Plan International. All completed infrastructure facilities were formally handed over to the Panchayats and beneficiaries of the three villages.



Project Title: Young Health program

Location: Adyar and Perungudi, Chennai

Focus Areas: Health

Donor: Plan International (India Chapter) /Astra Zeneca Period: April 2022 to March 2023

The **Young Health Program (YHP)** aimed to improve the health and well-being of girls and boys aged **10–24 years** in Chennai. The program focuses on preventing **five key risk behaviours** that can lead to non-communicable diseases later in life: tobacco use, harmful alcohol use, risky sexual behaviour, physical inactivity, and unhealthy diets. While tobacco and alcohol use are well studied, the program also addresses lesser-known risk behaviours through education and awareness.



Results and Impact

- Increased awareness and skills among children and adolescents through centre-based and peer-led sessions
- Improved understanding of child rights and protection among children, parents, and community members
- Enhanced physical and emotional well-being of children through skill development and extracurricular activities
- Strengthened parental and community support systems for child safety and development
- Built youth leadership capacity to sustain awareness and community action

Key Milestones

- 2,212 students reached through module-based sessions at centre level
- 701 students in Perungudi and 372 students in Adyar reached through peer educator sessions
- 742 community members covered through child rights awareness programs
- 1,655 children participated in skill development and extracurricular activities such as yoga, physical exercise, and library sessions
- 461 children (113 boys and 348 girls) trained on child rights and child protection
- 400 parents and care givers were trained
- Good rapport with parents, community, schools, Anganwadi's and other stake holders enabled YHP to expand its reach
- Trained 150 young people on global manual



Project Title: Comprehensive School Improvement Program to Promote Model Schools

Location: 10 schools & 30 villages in Puducherry UT
Focus Areas: Education, Awareness Generation, Health
Donor: Plan International (India Chapter) /Eaton India Period: Feb'19 to June 22

REAL, in partnership with **Plan International (India)** and **Eaton Technologies**, implemented the **Comprehensive Model School Project** to promote quality remedial education. The project worked with **10 schools across 30 villages** to improve overall school development in line with **RTE provisions**.



At the **school level**, activities included creating child-friendly classrooms, conducting child safety audits and risk mapping, providing remedial classes to improve age-appropriate learning, and training teachers on the use of sports kits.

Key Milestones

- Remedial education supported 1,010 children with improved learning outcomes
- Better access to water, sanitation, and hygiene created a healthier learning environment
- Science labs, libraries, and child-friendly classrooms were set up with new learning materials
- Street plays and film show increased community awareness on RTE, health, and nutrition

At the **village level**, the project created awareness on health and hygiene, the Right to Education Act, and the importance of education, nutrition, and child well-being.

To strengthen infrastructure, toilets, handwash facilities, drinking water systems, libraries, and science labs were renovated in all 10 schools. The project reached students, teachers, parents, community members, local authorities, and education officials.

Due to its success, the project is recommended for **in Puducherry**, and mobilize support from other donors.

Project Title: COVID-19 Intervention in 20 villages of Villupuram District

Location: 20 villages in Vikravandi and Mailam Block

Focus Areas: Education, Awareness Generation, Health

Donor: KKS / Merck Family Foundation Period: Feb'21 to April'22

With support from **KKS / Merck Family Foundation**, this project addressed post-COVID challenges and improved the quality of life of children, adolescents, and families, with special focus on girls and women.

The project helped children continue their education and life skills learning through digital and online platforms. Women were supported to increase their income by preparing nutritious snacks for digital learning centres and producing sanitary napkins. The project also distributed dry rations, education kits, and hygiene kits to affected families in 20 villages.



At the end of the project, clear positive impacts were observed on children's education, nutrition, and participation in extracurricular activities. Community members expressed a strong need for continuation of such support. The project was successfully completed in **April 2022**.

Key Milestones

- 5,000 people increased awareness on COVID-19 prevention and resilience
- 1,410 children continued learning during the pandemic and improved their nutrition
- 687 children (Classes 6–7) supported through home-based learning
- 723 children (Classes 8–10) benefited from digital learning
- 90% of smart class students passed the Class 10 examination
- 144 women SHG members increased their monthly income from ₹4,000 to ₹6,000 through livelihood activities

Project Title: Improvement of WASH in schools of Villupuram District

Location: 10 villages

Focus Areas: Education, Awareness Generation, Health Awareness, WASH

Donor: KKS/KKF/BMZ Period: April 2020 to Dec 2023

The project aims to improve **Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)** facilities in **15 selected schools** in Villupuram District, with active participation from children and support from teachers, parents, and local communities.



Key activities included construction and repair of **girls' and boys' toilets**, installation of **handwashing units and safe drinking water facilities**, formation of **children's clubs, School Management Committees (SMCs), and WASH ambassador groups**, and capacity-building training on WASH, health, and menstrual hygiene.

Children aged **6–15 years** were the primary beneficiaries. The project directly benefited **2,072 children and 148 teachers**, and worked closely with PRI members, the Education Department, block and district officials, and community stakeholders.

Key Milestones of the project:

- 6 new toilets, 8 toilet repairs, installation of 6 hand wash, 3 RO water and 7 incinerators at Siruvai, Pombur, Periyakozhuvai, Pathirapuliyur, and Parangani were completed and handed over to the schools.
- The training was provided to 1301 children on WASH activities, 100 adolescent girls on MHM (Menstrual Hygiene Management), 65 parents on SMC concepts, 119 representatives on the WASH ambassador program, and 889 community members on Advocacy and Campaigns.
- 10 solar water purification machines and 50 bottles were provided to the government primary school, Seiyankuppam



Project Title: Promotion of Child Rights and Child Protection in Cuddalore District

Location: 10 villages in Kurinjipadi Block

Focus Areas: Child Rights, Livelihood, Education and Women Empowerment

Donor: KKS/BMZ/Making More Health Period: August 2021 to January 2025

With support from **KKS**, the project **“Promotion of Child Rights and Child Protection in Cuddalore District, Tamil Nadu”** successfully completed its first year and entered the second year of implementation.

The project aims to strengthen child-friendly accountability mechanisms within the child protection system to safeguard children from abuse, neglect, and exploitation at the village, block, and district levels. Key activities included formation and strengthening of children’s clubs, adolescent and youth groups, school monitoring committees, self-help groups, and village-level child protection committees. Capacity-building trainings were conducted for children, community members, and local institutions on child protection, water, and sanitation.

During 2022–2023, the project created a positive impact on the lives of children and women in 10 target villages. Women, beyond their involvement in microfinance activities, became more aware of children’s rights and better equipped to protect their children. Improvements were also seen in basic life skills related to health, sanitation, and waste management.

Key Milestones of the project:

- 2150 children in the age group 6 to 15 years benefitted through CB on CRCP (Child Rights and Child Protection), leadership, ToT trainings, exposure visits, traditional folks etc.,
- 626 adolescents in the age group 16 to 18 years benefitted from career goal setting, life skills and menstrual hygiene
- 720 youth from 19 to 24 years are involved in CB on CRCP, Vocational, exposure and job linkages.
- 275 SHG members supported with the amount of Rs.2750000/- for IGA (105 goat rearing, 53 milch animal rearing, 30 agriculture, 27 tailoring, 60 other trades like duck rearing, cashew deshelling, petty shop, etc.)
- 59 SHGs with 968 members involved in thrift and credit activities and are linked under “Women Federation” and trained on SHG management, leadership, exposure, EDP and IGA trainings, federation concepts etc.
- Improved the sanitation facilities (3 new toilet, 3 renovations of toilets, and 4 handwash facilities), functional and being in use.



Project Title: Construction of Toilet and Providing Safe Drinking Water Facilities

Location: 3 schools of Cuddalore District

Focus Areas: Toilet Construction and Health Awareness

Donor: NABFINS Limited Period: March 2022 to March 2023

Many rural schools have toilets and water facilities, but they are often poorly maintained, inadequate, or unusable due to lack of running water. In most schools, hand pumps are the main water source and the water is untreated, making toilet facilities non-functional.

To address this issue, REAL developed a School WASH Project with support from NABFINS. The project supported three schools:

1. Panchayat Union Primary School, Madhanagopalapuram
2. Panchayat Union Middle School, Kodukkanpalayam
3. Panchayat Union Primary School, S. Puthur

The project provided new and fully renovated boys' and girls' toilets, including complete civil, electrical, and plumbing works. Handwashing units, water supply lines, leach pits, septic tanks, and IEC materials were also installed. In addition, RO drinking water systems (100 LPH) with storage tanks were set up in all three schools.

The project was completed successfully and the facilities were handed over to the school management and communities. Awareness sessions were also conducted for students, teachers, parents, Environmental Clubs, and School Management Committees to promote hygiene and proper use of the facilities.

Key Milestones

- Construction of School Toilets and RO Water Facilities in 3 rural schools.
- 447 children in the targeted 3 schools have improved access to clean and safe drinking water and sanitation facilities with enhanced hygienic practices.
- The school management, panchayat and school children sincerely share their gratitude to all those who were instrumental in providing the new toilets and RO filters.

Voice of Beneficiary: A year ago, our school was in very poor condition, with no proper toilets or safe drinking water. The campus was unhygienic and uncomfortable for children. Today, the school has clean and functional toilets with running water, RO drinking water, and child-friendly handwashing facilities. With NABFINS CSR support and REAL's guidance, the school environment has completely changed. The formation of Children's Clubs and a strengthened SMC have united teachers, parents, and the community to work together for the students' welfare. We sincerely thank REAL and the donor for this valuable support."

Income Generation Support

NABARD Financial Services Limited (NABFINS) is a subsidiary of National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). Their main objectives are to provide financial services in two broad areas of agriculture and microfinance. NABFINS provides credit and other facilities for promotion, expansion, commercialization and modernization of agriculture and allied activities. NABFINS engages in the business of providing micro finance services and other facilities to needy and disadvantaged sections of society for securing their prosperity. In partnership with NABFINS, REAL facilitated loans in total amount of Rs. 15.03 crore during this financial year. As of March 2023, a total of 323 SHG women from 174 villages across 10 blocks in the Cuddalore and Villupuram Districts took out credit for various purposes such as small business establishment, purchase of milch animals, dairy unit, goat rearing, agricultural cultivation, education, marriage, etc.

Volunteers Support during the year

Bridge Builder Program

Project Intervention Areas: Thirumanikuzhi

Project Period: August 2022 to March 2023

Every year, REAL receives volunteers from Germany to work as project interns for six months. Mr. Franz Jakob Kluge and Mr. Pablo Hunkler De La Cruz, BBP Volunteers from Germany involved in intensive volunteer service from August 2022 to March 2023. They conducted children workshops/camps for the school children and taught spoken English at Government School, Thirumanikuzhi. They employed play way teaching methods, arts and crafts, cultural activities and oriented through social media on environmental hazards. They did various documentation tasks especially refurbishing websites, video documentation and designing reports etc.



Volunteers visited the rural project areas and had discussions with community members and children. They observed their family background / health standards / livelihood / education / women empowerment etc. On the whole, volunteers are fully aware of the poverty standards and development issues faced by rural communities based on SDG.

Events of Celebration

World No-Tobacco Day Event Report: In order to raise awareness on tobacco usage and its causes, a grant event was held under the project ‘**Young Health program**’ – Phase I supported by PLAN INDIA and AstraZeneca. It was conducted at community hall in Annai Sathya Nagar, Adyar on 31st May 2022 where the young people and Peer educators from the projects had arranged stall with awareness raising drawing and posters. The event was graced with the presence of Dr.

Mr. Murugan – Health coordinator oriented about the functioning of HICs in Perungudi and Adayar through REAL/Plan



India/AstraZeneca. Competitions were conducted at school level including throwball, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi and Volley ball with 84 (M-46 & F-38) participants and at community Silambam and Boxing were conducted with the participation of 40 children (B-28 & G-12). 42 children (B-23 & G-19) at school level and 20 children (B-15 & G-5) have won the competitions and got prizes. A good rapport was built with school and community through this event and Mrs. K. Shanthi-Head Mistress –Perungudi GHSS and Mr. Nagarajan-Asst. HM appreciated the efforts taken by the YHP team.
