
Our Working Approach


Our Areas of Intervention

Project Highlights

Project Title: Improvement of WASH in schools of Villupuram District

Location: 10 villages

Focus Areas: Education, Awareness Generation, Health Awareness, WASH

Donor: KKS/KKF/BMZ Period: April 2020 to Dec 2023

Project Overview

This completed project targeted 2,447 children aged 6-15 and 106 teachers. Stakeholders included the Education Department, PRI institutions, SMC/PTA members, and civil society in project areas.

Key Activities

- Raised awareness on WASH practices, menstrual hygiene, self-defense, and government schemes.
- Supplied incinerators and supported career goal-setting for adolescent girls.
- Strengthened school management committees (SMCs) and facilitated clean, hygienic toilets.
- Improved WASH infrastructure, trained teachers on academic support, and maintained school facilities.
- Created conducive classrooms, wall paintings on WASH, environment, education, health, hygiene, tree plantation, and patriotism.
- Conducted advocacy and lobbying campaigns.

Stakeholder Collaboration

REAL built strong ties with village/block/district officials (DEO, BDO, Education Dept., PRIs, Revenue Dept., Swachh Bharat Mission, AWCs, Illam Thedi Kalvi). They provided inputs, guidelines, monitoring, and support for success.



Key outcomes

- Open defecation dropped to 55% among children/families.
- School dropouts fell to 5% after incinerator installations.
- Renovated 15 toilets, benefiting 2,540 children.
- Provided safe drinking water in 11 schools.
- 98% awareness of hand hygiene via trainings and facilities.
- 100% SMC functionality in the target government schools.

Project Title: Promotion of Child Rights and Child Protection in Cuddalore District

Location: 10 villages in Kurinjipadi Block

Focus Areas: Child Rights, Livelihood, Education and Women Empowerment

Donor: KKS/BMZ/Making More Health Period: August 2021 to April 2025

Project Overview

The KKS-supported "Promotion of Child Rights and Child Protection in Cuddalore District, Tamil Nadu" has completed two years and entered its third.

The goal: Build child-friendly accountability in protection systems to shield children from abuse, neglect, and exploitation at village, block, and district levels.

Major Activities (Current FY)

- Hosted a district-level event (Dec 14, 2023) in Kurinchipadi for 60 PRI, BDO, ICDS, women empowerment, and NGO reps; trained village child rights clubs on rights, protection, accountability, and participation.
- Organized exposure visits: 80 children to Cuddalore DCPU and Pondicherry's Abdul Kalam Science Centre/Planetarium/Museum; youths to Indian Institute of Public Administration; Board members to CRED NGO and Sirumalai farmer producer company.



Key outcomes

- Trained 1,016 women on federation, child rights, and protection.
- Raised awareness for 2,467 children/community members on rights mechanisms.
- Benefited 2,500 children via CRC centers and extracurricular skills.
- Supplied play/learning materials to 10 village schools and 10 Anganwadi's.
- Reactivated/strengthened 36 SHGs; formed 68 new SHGs with savings/docs.
- Gave IGP support (Rs. 27.5 lakhs) to 275 vulnerable women; revolving fund aided 24 more.
- Sensitized 135 panchayat officials/stakeholders on child rights.
- Trained 80 ICDS staff; 735 on EDP; 900 on income activities; 140 youths in vocational skills (tailoring, computer, beautician).
- Distributed IEC notices on project topics.

- Conducted trainings on child rights/protection, adolescent life skills, maternal health, leadership, entrepreneurship, income generation for SHGs, and job linkages for youths.
- Livelihood support boosted family incomes via petty shops, milch animals, tiffin centers, tailoring, duck rearing, and cashew deshelling—helping fund children's education and health.

Project Period: April 2023 to March 2024

Project Overview

REAL, partnering with Plan India, implements this project in Chennai's Perungudi, Adyar, and Neelankarai slums (second year). Focus: Youth health promotion (YHP) and non-communicable disease (NCD) prevention among adolescents and youth.

Major Activities (This FY)

- Identified and trained 70 peer educators on YHP manuals and NCD modules.
- Delivered technical sessions on mental wellbeing and gender equality.
- Launched e-rickshaw campaigns to sensitize communities/parents on NCD prevention.
- Sensitized teachers and SMC members.
- Organized street theatre for children.

Key Milestones

- Reached 1,994 students via module sessions.
- Community reach: 639 (76 men, 563 women) via sessions.
- E-rickshaw campaigns: 2,353 youth + 3,533 community members.
- Street theatre: 1,157 youth + 712 community members.
- 1,586 youth/community joined key events.
- Strong ties with parents, schools, ICDS, and stakeholders expanded reach.
- 4 girls started AstraZeneca internships; 2 IDG girls completed and got placed.



Project Title: Construction of 50 Low-Cost Housing
Location: Villupuram District
Focus Areas: Infrastructure
Donor: DESWOS Period: June 2023 – December 2024

Project Overview

TN Government identified vulnerable families (Dalit women/tribals, minorities, poorest of poor) for PMAY housing in five villages: Ennayiram, Esalam, Sathanur, Anilady, and Keezhvailamur. Government funds were insufficient, so REAL—with DESWOS-Germany support—assisted 50 families with Rs. 25,00,000 for pucca houses (Rs. 23,25,000 disbursed: Rs. 21,50,000 for 43 in Phase I; Rs. 1,75,000 for 7 in Phase II). Results: 33 families at 90% completion; 17 at 50%.

Additional Support

- Monitored government subsidies; helped families build rapport with officials—securing Rs. 45,29,300, 3,093 cement bags, and 8,767 kg steel for all 50.
- Provided trainings for 50 beneficiaries: government schemes/processes, financial literacy, health/hygiene, entrepreneurship, and milch animal care.
- Economic empowerment: Facilitated milch cow purchases



Key outcomes

- Rs. 16,75,000 housing funds to 42 beneficiaries.
- Oriented 50 on government schemes/processes.
- Trained 50 on financial literacy.
- Oriented 50 on milch care, entrepreneurship, health/hygiene.
- Supported 28 with milch animals via loans.
- Insured 28 animals; installed Azolla setups in 28 homes.

(Rs. 8,40,000 for 28 families via federation loans); insured animals; gave Rs. 3,000 each for backyard fodder/Azolla cultivation to boost milk yield and cut costs.

Mrs. Malar Ranganathan's Story

From Esalam village, Villupuram District, Tamil Nadu, Mrs. Malar Ranganathan shares her transformation. After her husband's death, this vulnerable widow lived in a cramped thatched home with her widowed daughter, son, daughter-in-law, and grandson. Monsoons worsened conditions, and low family income limited food and education.

Challenges and Support
Her son couldn't provide enough. Selected for PMAY (widow category), she got Rs. 26,000 initially but stalled due to funds. Through SHG, she joined REAL-DESWOS program: Rs. 50,000 housing aid restarted construction. Plus, Rs. 30,000 federation loan bought milch cows yielding 7 liters milk daily (Rs. 200 profit/day) for expenses and grandson's schooling. Trainings built her literacy and entrepreneurship skills.

Outcome
Grateful to REAL and DESWOS, she now leads a dignified life as a self-reliant entrepreneur.

Project Title: Creating a Safe and Conducive Learning Environment in 4 Schools	
Location: Cuddalore District	
Focus Areas: Education/ Water & Sanitation Infrastructure	
Donor: Royal Enfield	Period: June 2023 – June 2024



Project Overview

REAL improved safe learning environments in four Nallur Block schools (Cuddalore District, Tamil Nadu) via infrastructure, toilets, RO purifiers, incinerators, and child-friendly wall paintings.

Key Supports Provided

- Built 9 classrooms (2 each in Kodikalam, Kudalur, Maruvathur; 3 in Narasinga Mangalam) with IEC wall paintings for child-friendly spaces.
- New toilets for boys/girls in 3 schools (Kodikalam, Narasinga Mangalam, Maruvathur); renovated in Kudalur.
- Installed RO water purifiers in all 4 schools; incinerators in 2 middle schools.
- Supplied sports materials and child-friendly furniture for 323 children.
- Set up supplementary coaching centers in 4 villages (212 children) for reading, writing, dancing, singing, yoga, exercises.
- Trained on handwashing, toilet use, hygiene, health, and environmental protection.

Key Milestones

- Improvements: 93 in reading, 92 in writing, 57 in dancing, 22 in singing, 212 in yoga/exercises, 39 in drawing (from SERC).
- 12 supplementary center children competed in

Education Department's "KALAI THIRUVIZHA" art festival.

Voice of Beneficiary: Mrs. Kumari, Kudalur Primary School Teacher

Past Challenges
The school lacked learning spaces, had low attendance (only 5-6 in 1st standard), no sports gear, poor sanitation (open defecation nearby), and unsafe water causing diseases.

Project Impact
Enrollment jumped to double digits. Now offers safe, comfortable spaces with engaging wall paintings for education and literacy. Provides purified borewell water, sports materials, clean/vibrant premises.

Project Title: School Painting

Location: Villupuram District

Focus Areas: School Infrastructure, Keezhvailambur RC Primary School Renewal (Vallam Block, Villupuram District)

Donor: Global Village Renewal

Background

This 55-year-old Pondicherry Diocese school in Keezhvailambur posed safety risks for 15 years.

Past Supports

- 2010-2012: Global Village Renewal + Govt. scheme built pucca concrete building with 4 classrooms + cultural stage (inaugurated July 2012).
- 2017: Added full toilet block with handwash platform + kitchen for hygienic cooking.

Recent Renovations (July-Aug 2023)

- Masonry: Repaired steps/floors, wall plastering, compact stage.
- Carpentry/electrical: Fixed doors/windows.
- Painting: Classrooms, veranda, stage.
- Extra: Repaired kitchen + toilets (plumbing/handwash) for hygiene.

Outcomes

School now looks attractive, boosting regular attendance. Children enjoy safe learning; cooks prepare hygienic food efficiently. Toilet upgrades improved personal hygiene.

Past Challenges

School walls were damaged and faded from water stagnation, creating an unpleasant, distracting environment for children's studies.

Project Impact

Support from Jeff Waites, REAL, and GVR repainted the campus, kitchen, and toilets—now neat, pleasant, with beneficial educational wall write-ups.

Anilady School Toilet Project (GVR/Jeff Waites Support)

Background

In July 2023, GVR aided Keezhvailambur School renovations. During handover with Mr. Jeff, Anilady headmaster requested girls' toilets. REAL proposed it; Mr. Jeff funded construction.

Implementation

Pre-assessment done; work started Nov 8, 2023 (Bhoomi Pooja). Included toilets, handwash, dressing room, incinerator.

Inauguration

April 22, 2024: Rev. Fr. Peter Rajendiran (Episcopal Vicar), Rev. Fr. S. Anandhraj, Rev. Fr. A. Arputharaj, REAL's Mr. V. Arumugam & Mr. A. Lawrence, headmaster, teachers, parents, community attended.

Outcomes

Provides healthy WASH access, boosting attendance/achievement. Children now practice hygiene and maintain facilities—happy, healthy, and hygienic.

Income Generation Support

In collaboration with NABFINS, REAL successfully facilitated loans totaling ₹7.72 crore during the current financial year. As of March 2024, a total of 184 Self-Help Group (SHG) women from 174 villages across 10 blocks in the Cuddalore District and Villupuram District have accessed credit for diverse livelihood and social needs, including establishment of small businesses, procurement of milch animals, development of dairy units, goat rearing, agricultural cultivation, education, and marriage-related expenses.

Events of Celebration/ Addressing Special Days

REAL's awareness campaigns unfolded dynamically through 2023 and early 2024, sequenced by year and month for maximum community impact. These chronological events wove education into daily life, fostering healthier, more empowered communities.

May 2023



World No Tobacco Day on May 31 ignited action twice over. In S. Puthur and Subramaniyapuram, Ms. Chitra and Mrs. Jerome Sahayani engaged



40 adolescents, youth club members, and children, exposing tobacco's dangers—cancer, heart disease, lung disorders—and advocating nutrition, sports, yoga, and exercise. Participants pledged to reject tobacco and educate families/neighbors. Meanwhile, Perungudi (in-person) and Adyar (virtual) drew 44 youth and parents for health coordinator-led sessions on harms and prevention, culminating in a community silent rally.

June 2023

World Environment Day – June 5, 2023

In Parangani village, REAL collaborated with Isha Foundation for 90 community members, including the Panchayat president, school headmaster, and Isha coordinator. They focused on eco-awareness through rallies and pledges.



World Environment Day (Cluster Level) – June 6, 2023

Mr. Anand, a Pondicherry environmentalist, led 72 participants in Krishnankuppam—women groups, youth clubs, and children—planting trees and discussing sustainability.

School Enrolment Drive – June 2023 :10 villages: Home visits and meetings with SHGs, SMCs, child welfare committees, youth/adolescent/children clubs. Enrolled 131 students (Classes 1-3) in government/aided schools.



World Day Against Child Labour on June 12 mobilized 260 across 10 villages—SHG members, youth, adolescent girls/boys, and children clubs—via the slogan “Social Justice for All. End Child Labour!” Street rallies and meetings tackled RTE, free education, noon meals, dropouts, helplines, child rights/protection, vocational skills, IGP, and school toilets.

World Environment Day followed: June 5 in Parangani with Isha Foundation united 90 community members, Panchayat president, headmaster, and Isha coordinator for eco-pledges. June 6 cluster event in Krishnankuppam, led by environmentalist Mr. Anand, involved 72 from women/youth/children clubs in sustainability drives. The month closed with a school enrolment drive, using home visits and networks (SHGs, SMCs, welfare committees, clubs) to enroll 131 Class 1-3 students in government/aided schools across 10 villages.

August 2023

International Youth Day on August 12 in Adyar and Perungudi featured 147 youth in indoor games like carrom, chess, drawing, lemon-spoon, and musical chairs; October 24/26 added 105 in outdoor kabaddi, boxing, kho-kho, and volleyball.



August 15, Independence Day in Neelankarai, opened with peer educators' Tamil Thai Vazthu, welcomes by Mr. Kumara, dance by Ms. Deepika, speech by Mr. Pradhap on the 77th anniversary, and prize distribution by chiefs Mr. Singamuthu and Mr. John Ramesh.



September 2023

World Heart Day on September 29 at Neelankarai HIC (digital elsewhere) reached 113 youth; Dr. Saraswathi detailed heart health, inspiring a drawing contest with prizes. Late October school/community sessions averaged 104 participants.



October 2023

October 11, International Day for Girls at AstraZeneca Chennai mentored 13 PE girls, 20 RISE girls, 3 chaperones/HICFs by senior managers with tours and certifications.



October 16, World Anesthesia Day at Perungudi GH educated 20 children on "Anesthesia and Cancer Care"; Dr. Gowri highlighted its role, followed by addiction awareness for 60.



Sexual Reproductive Health Awareness Day at Neelankarai GHSS engaged 202 (61 Perungudi, 48 Adyar, 66 Neelankarai, 27 Thiruvannamiyur) on wellness and STI prevention.

November 2023



World Diabetes Day on November 14 at Neelankarai Govt. Middle School/PHC informed 74 children/adults on diabetes types, with sugar/weight testing.

February 2024



World Cancer Day on February 4 linked Perungudi HIC digitally, teaching 244 children cancer types, symptoms, risks, prevention, treatment, and lifestyles.

March 2024



National Girl Child Day and Child Rights Week on March 1 in Kullanjavadi drew 233 with Mrs. Sundhari (Social Welfare), Mr. Manivannan (Puliyur President), and Mrs. Malathi (ICDS), promoting Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, anti-child marriage/gender determination, and RTE.
